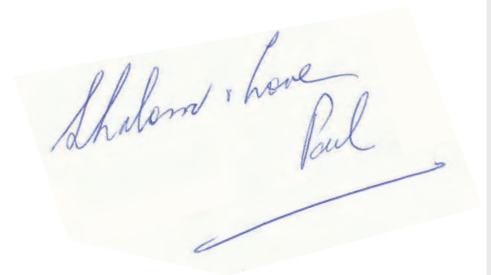
Communion to the Sick

Next date for Communion to the Sick is Monday 2nd November. Please phone the office if you would like to be added to our communion list.

The **Joint Declaration on the Doctrine of Justification** is the common statement signed at Augsburg, Germany by dialogue partners from the Lutheran World Federation and the Holy See of the Roman Catholic Church on October 31st 1999.

The document was the result of years of ecumenical dialogue, and articulates their common understanding of the doctrine of justification by God's grace through faith in Christ. The signing of the declaration acknowledged that the mutual condemnations pronounced in the 16th century, as a result of differences in expressing particularly this doctrine, no longer apply.

On July 18, 2006, members of the World Methodist Council meeting in Seoul, South Korea, voted unanimously to adopt this document as well. We rejoice that this critical milestone in inter-church relations has been reached and pray that ongoing efforts to promote Christian unity may be thereby made easier.

Inadequate access to safe drinking water affects the well-being of a huge number of people and is often the cause of disease, suffering, conflicts, poverty and even death. For a suitable solution to this problem, it "must be set in context in order to establish moral criteria based precisely on the value of life and the respect for rights and dignity of all human beings."

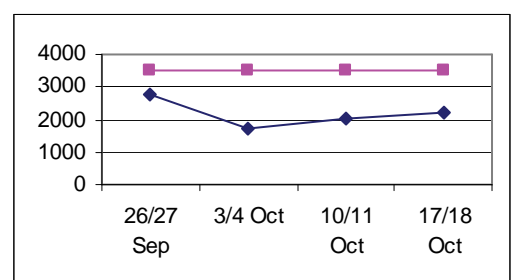
